3.9 Academic Advisement

Academic advising is an ongoing process across each University System of Georgia (USG) institution to ensure student success from admission to graduation. Each USG institution shall have maintain an academic advising framework for academic advising that supports students in the effective use of resources to identify and maintain a path toward to develop cognitive and non-cognitive skills in each student that promote a productive academic mindset and result in a clear understanding of educational, professional, and personal goals and a plan to achieve those goals.

The USG Chief Academic Officer shall establish guidelines in the Academic and Student

Affairs Handbook related to academic advisement.

3.9.1 Undergraduate Academic Advisement

The academic advising framework shall also include provisions for advising students throughout their undergraduate education, including provisions for monitoring and documenting student progress toward educational goals and providing exit work for students.
